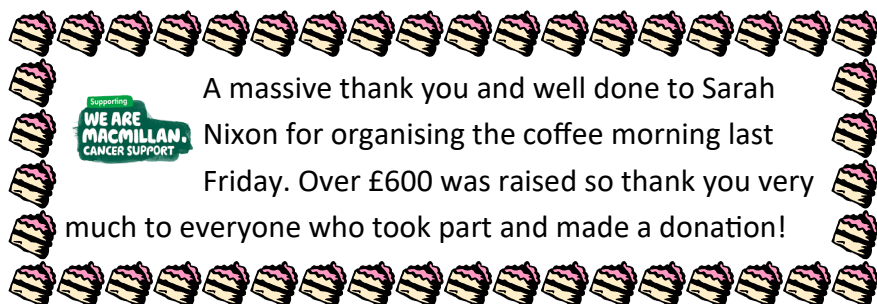
Way has contacted the school to share their concern about how some parents are dropping their children off in the mornings.
